

Scouts BSA Troop 150 Leadership Requirements Agreement

I, ______ agree to the attendance and leadership requirements below for my position of ______ during the six-month term from (circle applicable months): the first day of - <u>May</u> <u>November</u> through the last day of - <u>October</u> <u>April</u>.

I understand that the current edition of the <u>Troop 150 Leadership Guide: Information for</u> <u>All Youth Leaders</u> is the governing document for all leadership requirements, job duties, and other administrative policies regarding leadership in Troop 150 and I will completely adhere to it. It is my responsibility to be knowledgeable and observant of all leadership requirements (including attendance requirements) and job duties which will be expected of me, as delineated in the aforementioned guide. The "General Requirements for Serving in a Leadership Position" section, which applies to all Troop 150 leaders, is included here:

- 1. You must meet all of the qualifications for the leadership position that you are seeking in order to hold that position.
- 2. You must attend almost all troop meetings, ceremonies, campouts, day trips, and other events. It is important that you be in attendance at almost all of these events so that you can fully perform your job duties. You must especially attend the meetings/events that are important for your position (example: Quartermasters should attend all equipment pulls). Additionally, you are expected to be early for all meetings and event departures.
 - a. Only absences for very good reason, that your direct leader/SPL/SM was notified of and approved of at least a week in advance (where possible), and where you have arranged for another Scout to cover your duties, will be excused.
 - b. Any more than one un-excused absence is grounds for losing credit toward your leadership rank requirement and for being removed from your leadership position.
- 3. You must perform all of your job duties to the best of your ability. You were elected or appointed to your position to work on and complete these important jobs.
- 4. Enthusiastically wear your full uniform.
- 5. Obey the Scout Oath and Law.

Additionally, I must attend the mandatory leadership training, to be held on the Monday after Patrol Leader elections, and to have attended the Troop 150 ILST within a year of taking my current position. Furthermore, I must develop my own goals to achieve in my leadership position, this term. I will be regularly reviewed by the PLC and the troop adult leadership on those goals and on my status of meeting the Troop's leadership requirements.

My direct youth leader, the PLC, other youth leaders or Scouts, and/or the Scoutmaster Corps are available to provide assistance to me, when requested and as needed. Upon request, the PLC and/or Scoutmaster Corps may review any issues I may have regarding this agreement and they may make amendments or exemptions accordingly. Lastly, I understand the penalties that the Scoutmaster Corps and/or PLC may impose upon me for unsatisfactorily meeting my expectations, requirements, and/or goals, including the potential of not earning credit toward my leadership rank requirement and/or removal from my leadership position this term.
